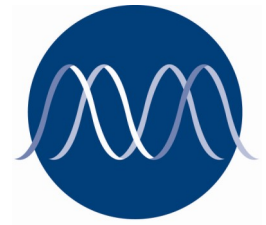

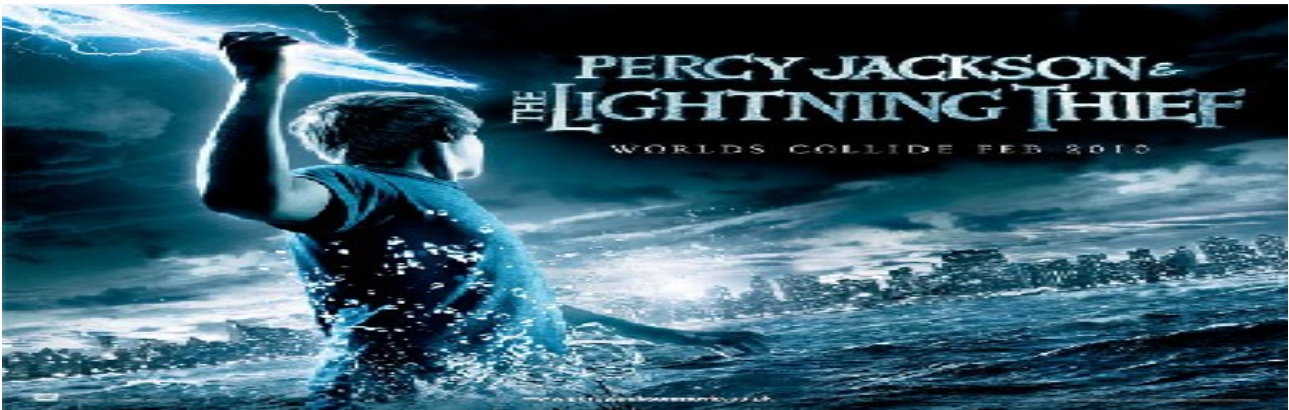

Inter-Generational Project
